
How to Access Education Databases and Find Scholarly Journal Articles

- 1. Go to the library's website at <u>library.wilson.edu</u>.
- 2. To find the Education Databases:
 - a. Click on the Subject Specific Resources tab.



b. Choose Education on the left-hand side of the screen.

- 3. Now you can fill in the search boxes to find sources on your topic.
- 4. Before you start looking through the list of sources, you will need to take some time to filter your results, in order to make sure you are following your assignment guidelines.
 - a. If you only need one article, I would suggest that you limit to fulltext, which means that you can view the whole article right on the screen.
 - b. I would also limit the publication dates since you are most likely looking for more recent information on the teaching and learning process. In this picture, you can see I limited the dates to 2010-the present.
 - c. Additionally, you want to check the box to limit your results to scholarly (peer reviewed) journal articles.

5. The other thing you want to pay attention to is the geographical location of your articles. Most professors prefer that you find articles that describe research/case studies that take place in classrooms/schools in the United States. The best way to limit your search geographically is just by looking at the sources you have found. In looking at these examples, you can tell from the record that #9 is based on a study in Illinois, while #10 takes place in Malaysia. If it's not easy to tell from the record, you can usually find out more information on the source itself (where it's published, location of the authors', etc.).
